Dear Ocate Cliffs family,

Our summer retreat is being planned and the dates are set for the last two weeks in June. This year we are combining an international camp through Volunteers for Peace [https://vfp.org/] with our autistic family and allies. Here is the announcement with lots more details:

Why a combined retreat like this? Sometimes when people put disabled people in groups with non-disabled "peers", they intend for the non-disabled people to model the "correct" way to be, and this sets up a two-tiered community. When I've been in the lower tier of groups like that, I have felt isolated and resented being there. So we are not doing that! Instead we are aiming to keep what is special about autistic space while experimenting with how to bring other people into it gently. Young people exploring a foreign country are rarely the types to take over control, so I expect this to be a community of supportive equals. We as autistic people are usually engaged in some form of "cross cultural" communication when we are communicating at all. In my travels I've often felt the barrier to people in other countries was no more difficult than with Americans. So my expectation is that everyone will be experiencing a similar level of barriers and that will avoid the two-tiered situation. Also, it is just really fun and engaging to have so much diversity and to be able to make bridges across languages and cultures.
