One of the experimental features of Ocate Cliffs is finding out whether autistic and non-autistic people can collaborate without sidelining the autistic ones. It is a widespread problem in disability-focused organizations, and it wasn't obvious when this started if it would be possible to keep the balance. I feel we have done really well with that, and I think having cultural diversity that comes with international volunteers helps.
